Beatrix Potter

Meet at the Beatrix Potter Museum, 9 College Court

Pre-booking required

In 1903 Beatrix Potter published one of her most loved tales, The Tailor of Gloucester. It was inspired by a visit she made to the city. This guided walk takes in the places of Gloucester which are closely connected with Beatrix Potter. The walk lasts about 45 mins.

Black & White Buildings

Meet at St Michael's Tower

Pre-booking required

A walking tour of 15th Century timber framed buildings in the city centre, pointing out structure, architecture and brief historical background. Are they really black and white? The walk lasts about 1 hour.

Blackfriars Priory ♦ E5 ♿ (partial)

Fri 11 & Sat 12th 10.30

Meeting point: Entrance off Ladybellegate Street

Pre- booking required

A chance to explore Britain's most complete Dominican Priory, owned by English Heritage and managed by Gloucester City. Most of the 13th century church remains, including a rare scissor-braced roof. Guided tours last about 1 hour. Face masks will be required.

Cathedral Precincts Tour ♦ B5 ♿

Meet at Cathedral South Porch

Pre-booking required

A history of the area surrounding the cathedral from the earliest Minster church up to the most recent developments. Tour lasts 1 hour.

Pre-Booking Required

There is an old saying 'As sure as God's in Gloucester'. Both Christianity and Gloucester have 2,000 years of history. This walk traces Gloucester's rich Christian heritage over those years as reflected in its people, places and events. The tour lasts about 1½ hours.

Explore the history of Gloucester through the medium of public statues. Learn about the people and events that made Gloucester the city it is today.

Meet outside the Waterways Museum in Gloucester Docks.

Take a guided walk around Britain's most inland port. The walk lasts about 1 hour.

Meet at London Road entrance

Pre-booking required

Take a guided tour of these fine gardens which have many fine trees and are home to three monuments of historical significance: Scriven's Conduit, the King's Board and the chancel of the 12th century leper chapel of St Mary Magdalene. The tour lasts about 1 hour.

Historic Characters ♦ D6 ♿

Meet at St Michael's Tower

Pre-booking required

This tour brings alive some of the famous and influential people and colourful characters who were born in Gloucester. Their fame and achievements extended far and wide but we remember their local origins. The walk lasts about 1¼ hours

Llanthony Secunda Priory ♦ H2 ♿
Sat 12 Sept & Mon 14 Sept 11.00
Meet by the panorama viewing point, near the towpath gate
Pre-booking required

This guided walk explores the priory which was founded in 1136, which by the end of the 15th century, was the richest Augustinian house in England entertaining the court of Henry VII in 1500 and 1501. The tour lasts about 1 hour.

Monks, Canons & Friars ♦ A5

Meet at St Oswald's Priory
Pre-booking required

Discover the Abbey and Priors of Gloucester and learn how the Monks, Canons and Friars lived and worked. The walk will take about 1 hour.

Richard III ♦ D6 ♿

Meet at St Michael's Tower
Pre-booking required

This tour tells of Richard III's important 3 day visit to Gloucester in 1483, as part of his Royal Progress and explains the granting of the significant Charter to the city. You will hear how he spent his time here and be shown some of the buildings he would have seen. The walk lasts about 1 hour.



Robert Raikes ♦ D6 ♿

Meet at St Michaels Tower
Pre-booking required

This walk tells the story of Robert Raikes, newspaper publisher, prison reformer and promoter of the Sunday School movement and shows some of the buildings in Gloucester connected with him.

Roman Times ♦ E7

Meet outside Boots, Eastgate St
Pre-booking required

From your guide, hear how the Romans came to Gloucester (Glevum). See the walls they built. Tread through the Forum (market place) and meet the Emperor Nerva. The walk lasts about 1 hour.

Saxon ♦ D6 ♿

Meet at St Michael's Tower
Pre-booking required

Discover the traces of Gloucester's Saxon history. Hear the story of Aethelflaed, Lady of the Mercians who died in 918 and was buried in Gloucester, and learn about the role she played in shaping the city. The walk will last around 1¼ hours.

Siege of Gloucester ♦ D6 ♿
Fri 11, Sat 12 & Sun 13 Sept 11.15 & 14.15
Meet at St Michael's Tower
Pre-booking required

This guided walk visits some of the places of interest connected with the siege of Gloucester which took place during the English Civil War. The siege was arguably Gloucester's finest hour when the small garrison of parliamentarians held out against the might of the Royal Army led by the King himself. The walk lasts about 1½ hours.

Gloucester Spa ♦ G6 ♿

Meet outside Christ Church, Brunswick Road
Pre-booking required

In the early 1800s, Gloucester had a thriving spa. This guided walk traces the history of The Spa and takes in some of the fine buildings that it generated. The walk lasts about 1 hour.

These talks by Gloucester Civic Trust tour guides will bring to life some of the characters and events that have shaped Gloucester's fascinating 2,000 years of history.

Gloucester born George Whitefield became a noted Evangelist both in this country and America in the 18th century. This year celebrates the 250th anniversary of his death He died at the relatively young age of 55 in Newburyport, Massachusetts. His legacy includes the formation of the Bethesda orphanage in Georgia, a Trust Fund which led to the development of the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia and he laid the foundations of the worldwide Methodist Church. Gloucestershire and the Atlantic Slave Trade

Gloucester was not involved in the slave trade to the extent that Bristol was. It has however surprising connections on both sides of the debate in the late 18th Century and early 19th that would lead to Abolition. This talk by Tony Condor looks at the information now available about the extent of the influence of the trade on the city and county and some of our well known characters who were involved.

Charles Wheatstone

John Jones, nuclear expert and local guide will talk on Wheatstone and how he helped bring about the modern world.

Wheatstone was a brilliant man, but quite shy, preferring Florence Nightingale or Michael Faraday to speak for him. However, his inspiration of others is perhaps more important than his own inventions.

The talk will last 45mins to an hour.

Entirely illustrated by old photographs this talk by Tony Condor will bring together stories from behind the scenes. Docks life was busy, visiting narrow boats came from the Midlands to mix with local Craft. Sailing ships came up the canal to unload. On the docks gangs of men worked to move the cargoes into warehouses and the businessmen sold on the grain and timber. From this mass of people come the stories of every day life, special events, and the tragedies that life throws up.

Of all the water courses that flow from the Cotswolds into the River Severn in the vicinity of Gloucester only one is called a river. Why is that so? The River Twyver has paid an important role in the development of Gloucester. Paul Drinkwater will be telling the fascinating story of its history, geography and uses over nearly 2,000 years.

Bearland House

Bearland House is an impressive 18th century building with an ornamental façade, forecourt, and fine wrought iron railings and gates. The interior boasts a carved wooden staircase and decorated ceilings. It was purchased by a high county Sheriff in 1764, and the ghost of his daughter is said to appear at the staircase window.

The Fleece Hotel

Note: steep and ancient steps making it only suitable for the able bodied.


A 12th century tunnel vaulted undercroft, which is thought to be the best example in Europe of a rich merchant's warehouse. Known locally as the "Monks Retreat" it was a lively and much loved bar when the Fleece was last open.

Gloucester Cathedral  ♦ **B5/6**

Discover 1000 years of history in one of Britain's greatest buildings. Formerly the Abbey of St Peter with origins dating from 679AD, the current building was begun in the 1100s. Visit highlights include the imposing pillars of the Norman Nave, the beautiful fan vaulted Cloister made famous around the world by appearing as Hogwarts School in the Harry Potter films, the elaborate tomb of King Edward II and the magnificent medieval Great East Window which is the size of a tennis court! Whilst you are here why not download the free Gloucester Cathedral app which allows you to explore the building and its stories using your own device, at your own pace.

Gloucester Furniture Exhibition Centre  ♦ **F5**

No booking required but limited numbers at any one time
A historic Roman wall inside the store is on public view. The lower level of the wall is part of a Roman Colonia dating back to 97AD. At street level it is a medieval building.

Llanthony Secunda Priory  ♦ **G1**

Step inside the newly restored listed buildings of Llanthony Secunda Priory. Founded in 1136, the history of this former Augustinian priory is told throughout 5 acres of grounds. Marvel at the magnificent medieval timber roof and late 15th – early 16th century brickwork. A surprising survival of a monastic precinct at the heart of Gloucester Docks.

Meeks' Shoe-shop ♦ **C6**

This Elizabethan building has a Georgian façade and on the first floor has a fine plaster ceiling dating from around 1600.

St Mary de Crypt Church and the Old Crypt Schoolrooms
Fri 11th to Mon 14 11am – 15.00
Southgate Street
Fully accessible with accessible toilet
No booking required

Explore the newly-refurbished medieval church and Tudor Schoolrooms. Download our app to discover stories from Gloucester's past: Raikes, Whitefield, Jemmy Wood and more. Shop, children's activities, exhibitions. Church tours on Friday & Saturday at 2.00 pm and Sunday at 12 noon. Bell tower tours for limited numbers.

St Michael's Tower  ♦ **D6**

The Cross, Gloucester
No booking required

St Michael's Bell Tower, now the admin centre of Gloucester Civic Trust, dates back to 1465. It has interesting heritage displays on the history of the church that once stood on the site, and 2 heritage bells made in Gloucester in 1710 by Abraham Rudhall. Refreshments are available.

St Nicholas's Church

A beautiful, medieval church with many interesting features and sympathetic Victorian restoration - Walton tomb, leaning tower, sanctuary knocker, squints, coat of arms. There will be a permanent exhibition of photographs of Blue Plaques that can be seen around the City.

Holy Trinity Church

This church is an interesting Grade 2-listed 1930s structure designed by Harold Stratton-Davis in a 15th century style.

Believed to be Britain's finest example of a timber framed town house. Built in 1560, it was once the hall of the Grocers' Guild, the mansion house of a Mayor of Gloucester and, in the 19th century, a lodging for assize judges. Meet outside on Westgate Street. Tours last about an hour.

In 1903 Beatrix Potter published one of her most loved tales, The Tailor of Gloucester, inspired by a visit she made to the city. In the kitchen there is playing a Peter Rabbit DVD where you can sit and watch at your leisure.

Recently re-opened by Gloucester Civic Trust this large Tudor building houses many exhibits from Gloucester's rich heritage. A Victorian schoolroom can be seen as well as one of the last remaining horse driven apple mills in the Country. In the same area is an old apple press and these two pieces of equipment are the essentials for Cider making. Find out about handmade pin manufacture which from the 16th Century to 19th Century Gloucester was the Countries major centre with one factory being housed in this building.

Also on site is a Café and a Tudor Garden should you need a break.

Mariners Church opened in 1849 and became popular with the townspeople as well as the mariners visiting the port. The Chaplain was responsible for visiting every ship that arrived. The church features fine stained glass windows. An active church continues to meet in the building.

Sula Lightship

LV14 Sula is a privately owned Historic Light vessel, located in Gloucester Harbour. Constructed in 1958 and in service off the Humber Estuary in the North Sea until 1985.

An opportunity to look around external areas in a guided walk. Maximum 4 per group. The route includes accessing steep ladders and regrettably is not suitable for anyone with mobility issues. Children can only attend with a responsible adult.

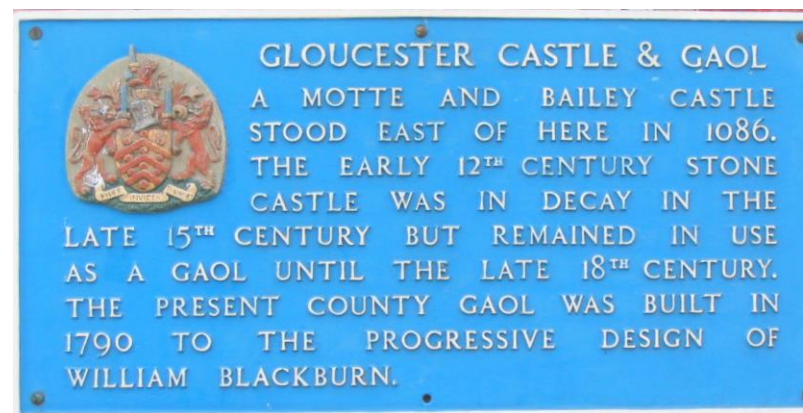
